About forced adoption

Between 1940 and 1990, many Australian women and infants were separated. This was known as 'forced adoption' and was unethical and often illegal.

In 2013 the Australian Government formally apologised to everyone who was affected by forced adoption.

They also set up Forced Adoption Support Services around Australia. These services help people affected by forced adoption.

Relationships Australia Victoria provides a Forced Adoption Support Service in Victoria.
